• Many of you have already used Zoom, but some may have not. For that reason, the TAPE officers will be offering "practice" meetings before the actual event.

If you wish to participate in a practice Zoom meeting before the conference, you will need to have Zoom on your device. You may obtain Zoom for free either at an app store or at zoom.com

If you're new to Zoom, the practice Zoom meeting will give you a chance to:

- * Respond to a Zoom invitation
- * Attend a Zoom meeting
- * Verify that your camera and audio are working

The January Board Meeting of the American Electrology Association was held on Saturday, January 23, 2021 on Zoom. Here are a few things that I thought might be useful to you:

- -The AEA currently has 737 members. 437 are CPEs.
- -The AEA website is being overhauled. It will be more user friendly and mobile friendly. System updates will begin in March and continue through October but they will be transparent to users.
- -The AEA Store has been down. The store security was breached in December. The site will be back up soon. At this time, you cannot renew your membership or take exams online. If you submit JOE exams by mail, please use the address listed above.
